ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS RECYCLING ASSOCIATION (EPRA)

Electronic Products Recycling Association (EPRA) is the national, not-for-profit entity chartered with improving the efficiency and effectiveness of Canada's industry-led and regulated electronics stewardship programs. Members of Electronics Product Stewardship Canada and the Retail Council of Canada established EPRA in 2011.

EPRA NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

Electronic Products Recycling Association (EPRA) Newfoundland and Labrador oversees an industry-led and government-approved end-of-life electronics recycling program available to consumers and businesses throughout the province.

PROGRAM LAUNCH

Effective August 1, 2013, all residents and businesses in Newfoundland and Labrador can recycle end-of-life electronics FREE OF CHARGE through an approved EPRA Newfoundland and Labrador Drop-off Centre.

PRODUCTS COLLECTED AND ENVIRONMENTAL HANDLING FEE

Environmental Handling Fees (EHFs) are charged on the sale and distribution of all new electronics products regulated in Newfoundland and Labrador.

The fee paid at time of purchase is used to cover the cost of collection, transportation and recycling of end of life electronics. All program revenue will be used for the collection, transportation and responsible recycling of end-of-life electronics, as well as program administration. The following EHFs will be charged on the sale and distribution of new electronics products in Newfoundland and Labrador:

- Desktop Computers - \$10.50 (including bundled components)
- Computer Peripherals - \$1.05
- Portable Computers - 2.50
- Desktop Printers - \$7.75
- Display Devices (televisions & monitors) -
 - ≤ 29" – \$12.25 EHF
 - 30-45" – \$24.50 EHF
 - ≥ 46" – \$43.50 EHF
- Personal/Portable Audio/Video Systems - \$0.45
- Vehicle Audio/Video Systems (Aftermarket) - \$3.25
- Home Audio/Video Systems - \$4.00
- Home Theatre in a Box (HTB) Systems - \$7.20
- Non-Cellular Telephones - \$1.00

All EHFs are subject to applicable sales taxes.

DROP-OFF CENTRES

On July 30, 2013, Drop-off Centre locations will be announced and posted online at www.recycleMYelectronics.ca/nl.

Effective August 1, 2013, consumers and businesses in Newfoundland and Labrador will be able to responsibly recycle their end-of-life electronics free of charge, simply by dropping off their old or unwanted products at any EPRA Drop-off Centre.

Nineteen permanent collection facilities will be operational throughout the province by the end of year one, and annual collection events will be implemented in an additional 31 communities by the end of year two.

RESPONSIBLE RECYCLING

EPRA is committed to ensuring that end-of-life electronic products collected through our Drop-off Centre network are recycled in a manner that protects the environment as well as worker health and safety.

EPRA only works with recyclers who have been audited and approved under the national Recycler Qualification Program (RQP), which is designed by the electronics industry to ensure that end-of-life-electronics (EOLE) are managed in a safe and environmentally-sound manner.
